Feedback Analysis Report

Introduction and Objectives:

Rayat Shikshan Sanstha's, **Prof. Dr. N. D. Patil Mahavidyalaya, Malkapur** was established in the year 1992. The college aims at the overall development of the students to become entrepreneurs and professionals in the respective disciplines. Every year a survey was conducted to assess the satisfaction of all the stakeholders (Students, Parents, Alumni, Teachers, and Employers) regarding curriculum of the college. The college is permanently affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and follow curriculum prescribed by university. Receiving positive or negative feedback from these stakeholders is important as both these are crucial in helping monitor and evaluate the provision. Listening to what stakeholder say is a contributing factor to running a successful college or institution.

Methodology

In every academic year, we ask all the stakeholders' to fill a feedback form which is made available on college website. Every year data was collected during the period 1st March to 10th March. But due to COVID pandemic, for this academic year, data was collected after lockdown period. The link of feedback form was also made available to all stakeholders' on their email address, whatsapp account and also college website. Filling of feedback is voluntary.

For the academic year 2019-20, there were 856 registered students at the college. Out of which, Two hundred and sixty (263) students responded to the survey, providing a response rate of 30%. The analyses presented in this report are based on the responses of the 263 students' to the survey.

Design of Feedback

The responses from the parents are collected on the two point scale

- 1) Yes
- 2) No

The responses from the students, teachers, alumni and employers are collected on the five point Likert scale.

- 1) Strongly Agree
- 2) Agree
- 3) Neutral
- 4) Disagree
- 5) Strongly Disagree

Feedback analysis report of all Stakeholders, Academic Year 2019-20

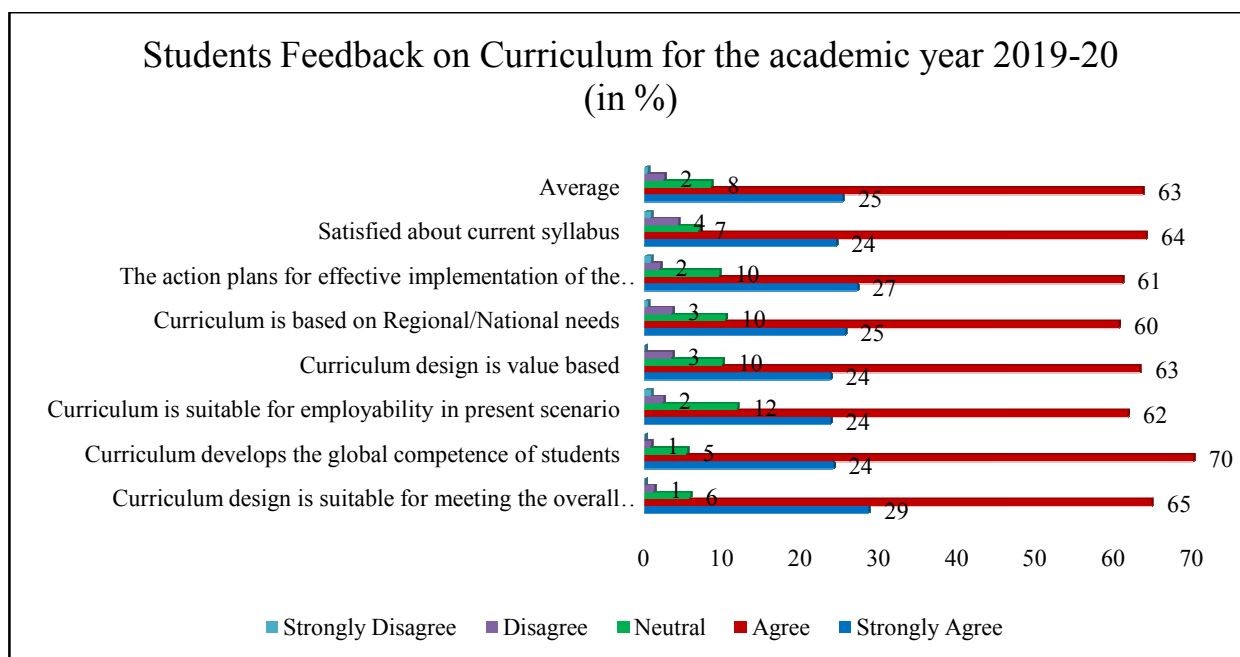
Overall Evaluation

Feedback was collected and analysed by Feedback Analysis Committee of the college. Opinion of all stakeholders are obtained about each parameter in percentage.

- **Student Feedback**

The respondent sample is broadly representative of the student population with respect to gender, programme level and course. We have received 263 students' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 189 female and 74 male respondents in the survey sample. Most respondents are pursuing programmes at the bachelor's degree level (90%).

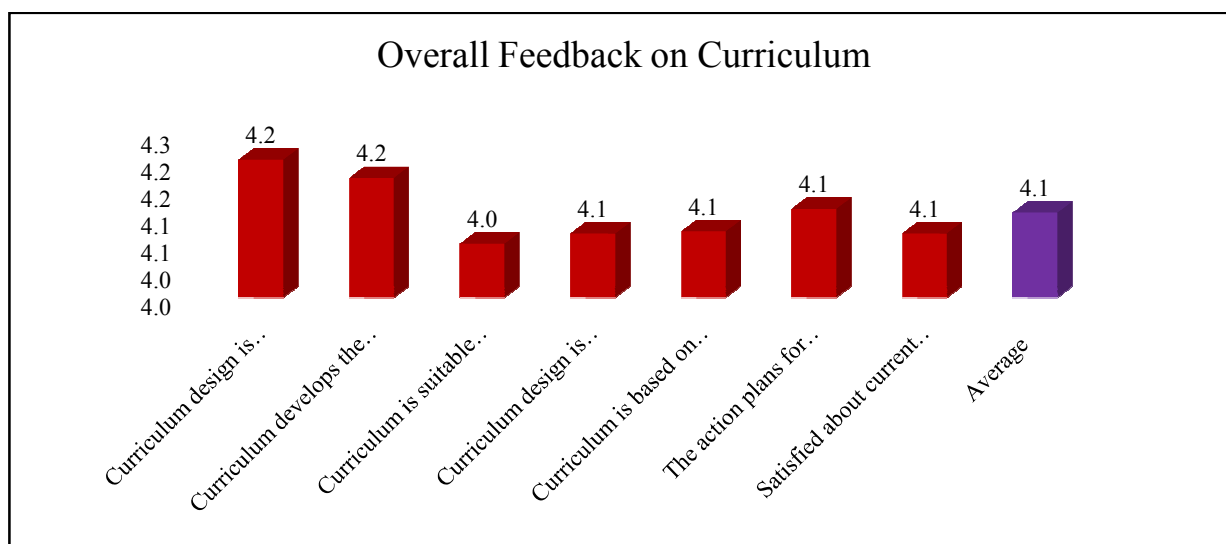
Following chart and table shows the summary of the responses given by students for each parameter.



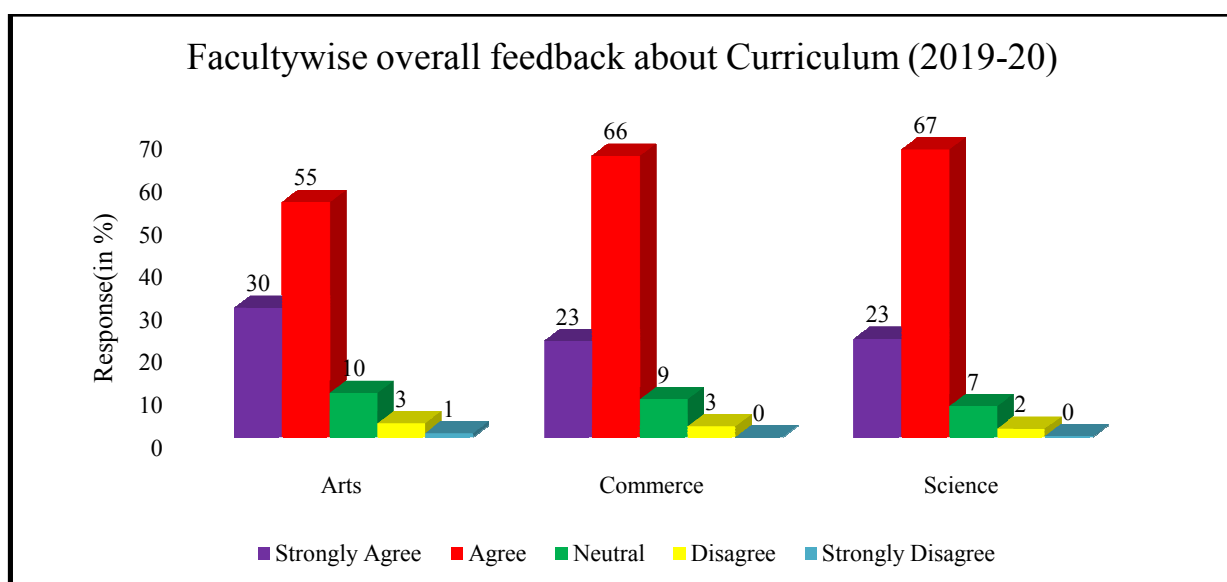

About 29% students are strongly agreeing and 64% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. More than 94% students are agreeing with the curriculum which develop global competence, whereas 1% are not agreeing with it. About 24% students are strongly agreeing and 61% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability. But there are 3% students who are not agreeing with it. About 24% students are strongly agreeing and 62% are agreeing with the current syllabus is value based and it also based on national / regional values. There are 24% students who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 64% are satisfied and 7% neutral. But there are also about 5% students who are completely dissatisfied with the syllabus. They are expecting some changes in it.



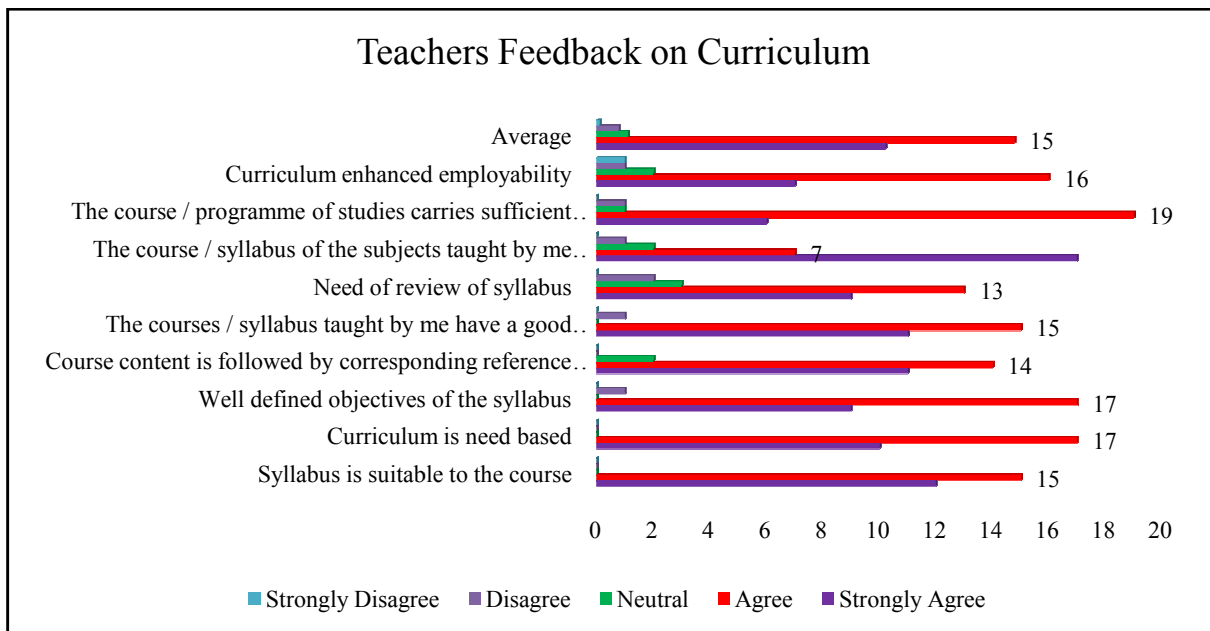
Overall feedback for each evaluation point is more than the average value (4.1) (excluding third evaluation point).



Most of the students (30% arts, 23% commerce, 23% science) are strongly agreeing with the current curriculum of the graduation. There is only 1% of arts faculty students who are opposing current syllabus. There are also some students (1%) from arts faculty who chose to remain neutral.

- **Teachers Feedback**

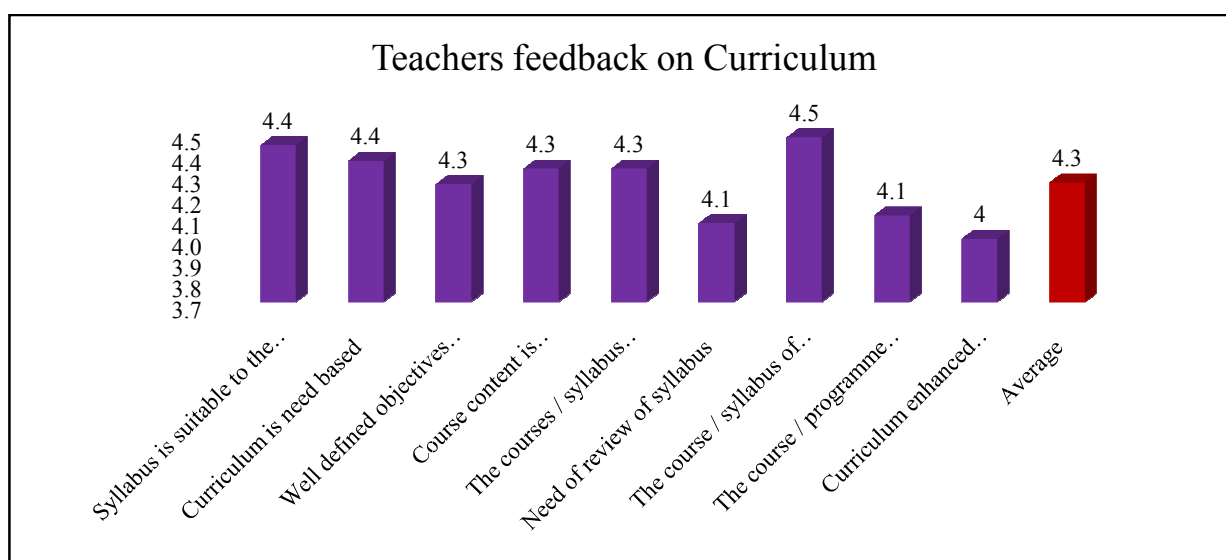
We have received 28 teachers' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 26 males and 2 female respondents in the survey sample. Following table shows the summary of the responses given by teacher for each parameter.



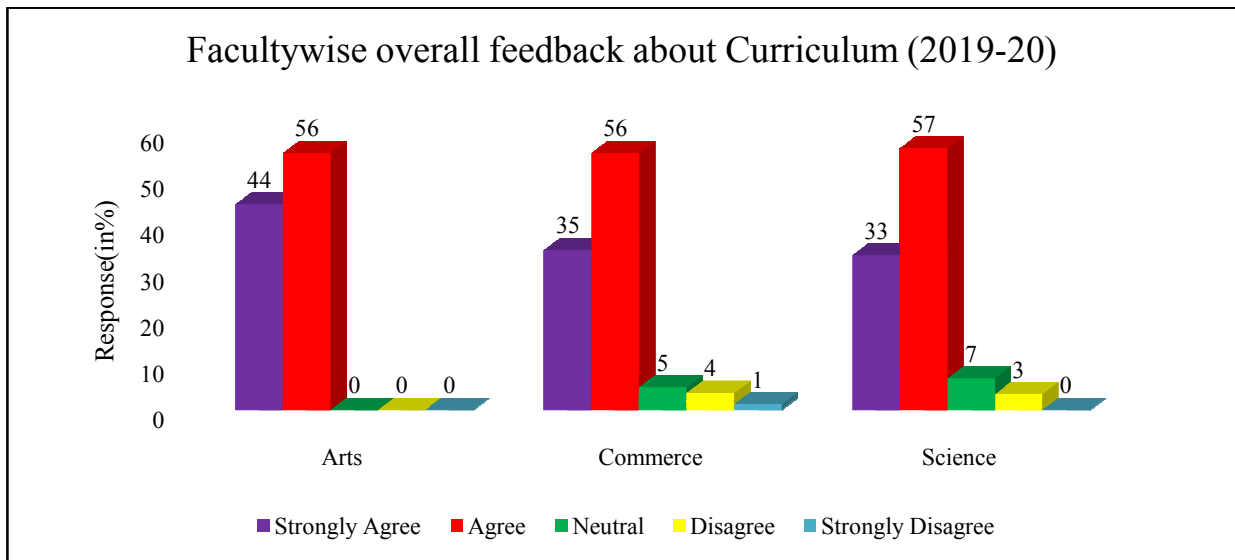

About 44% teachers are strongly agreeing and 56% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for the course. About 37% teachers are strongly agreeing and 63% are agreeing with the current syllabus is need based. There are 33% teachers who are strongly agreeing and 63% are agreeing with the objectives of the syllabus. More than 90% teachers are agreeing with the curriculum which follow corresponding reference material. Most of the teachers are agreeing with the syllabus which has appropriate balance between theory and applications and it also increase their interest in it. There are lot of people (81%) who are expecting changes in it. About 22% and 70% are strongly and agreeing with the course / programme of studies which carries sufficient number of optional papers. There are 7% teachers who are dissatisfied with current curriculum and expecting some changes in it.



Most of the time overall feedback for evaluation point is more than the average value (4.3)

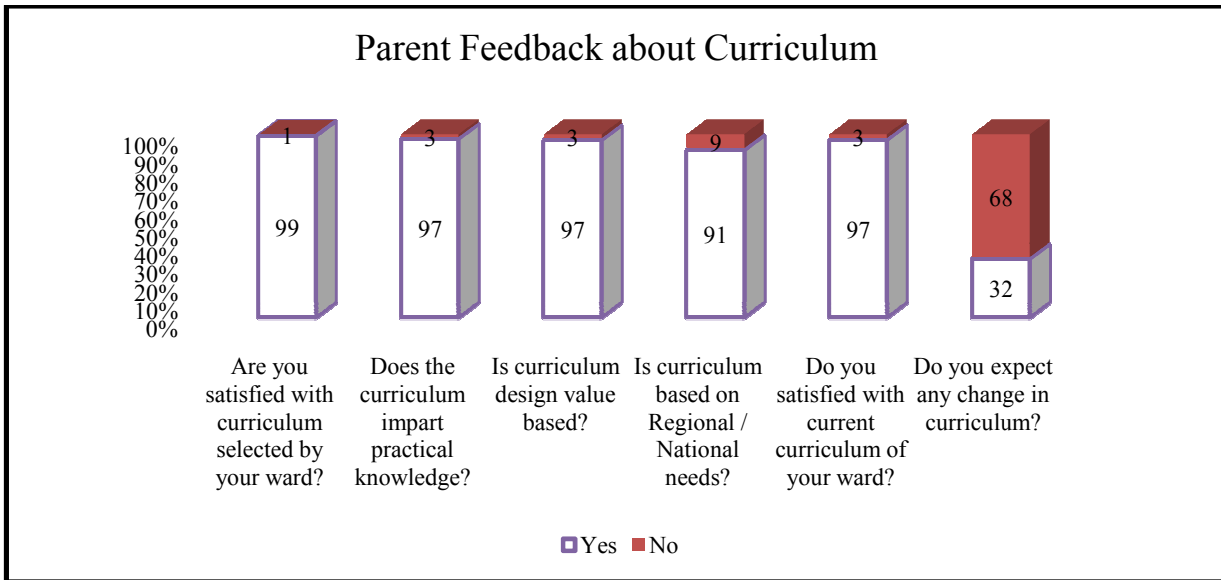


Most of the teachers are agreeing with the current curriculum of the graduation. There is only 1% of commerce faculty members who are opposing current syllabus. There are also some teachers (4%, 3%) from commerce and science faculty respectively are chose to remain neutral.

- **Parent Feedback:**

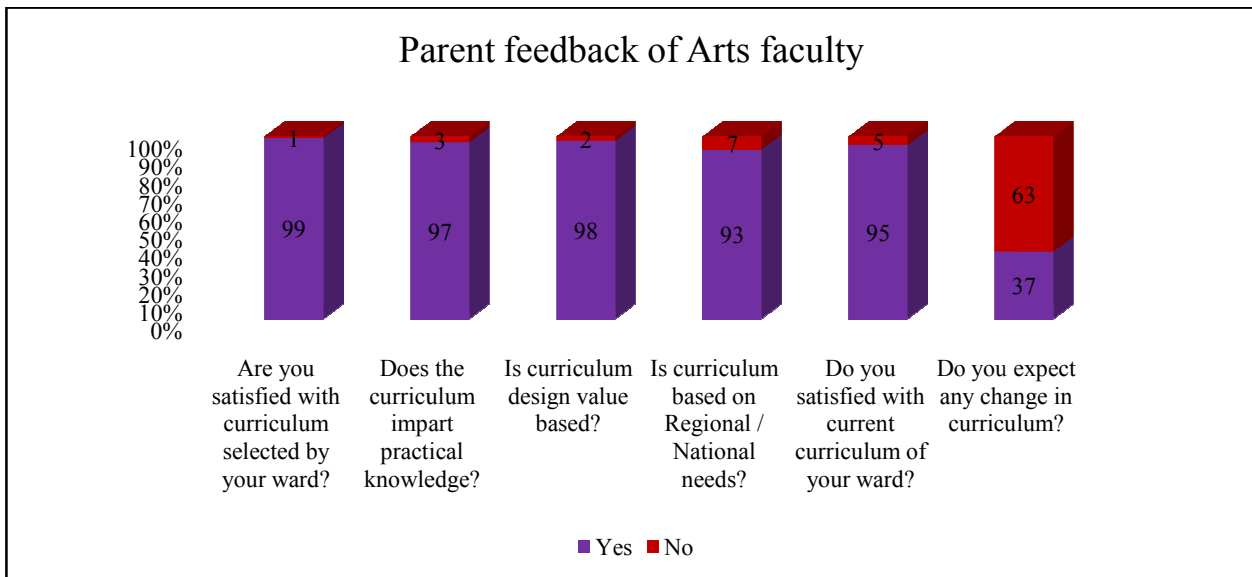

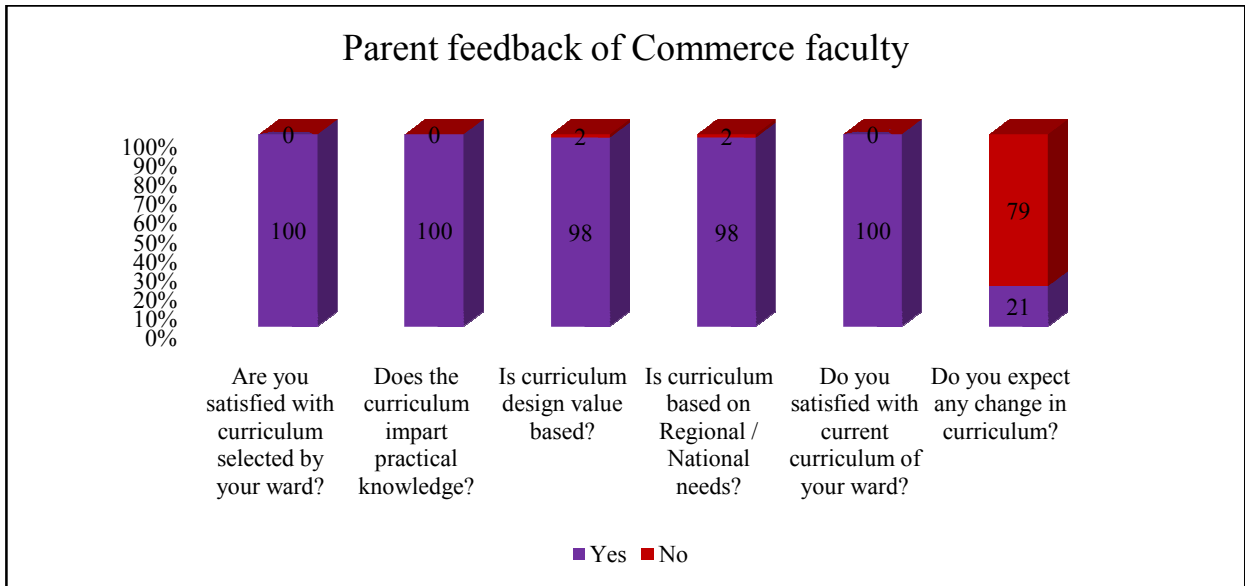
About 99% of the parents are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. And only 1% has said that it is not good. There are about 97% parents who are agreeing that curriculum is practical knowledge based and they are satisfied with it. 97% of parents are agreeing with the point that the curriculum of college is value based and it impart regional and national needs (91%). There are about 68% parents who are expecting some changes in curriculum and about 32% has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents have rated excellent for all the points considered here.

- **Faculty wise Feedback:**

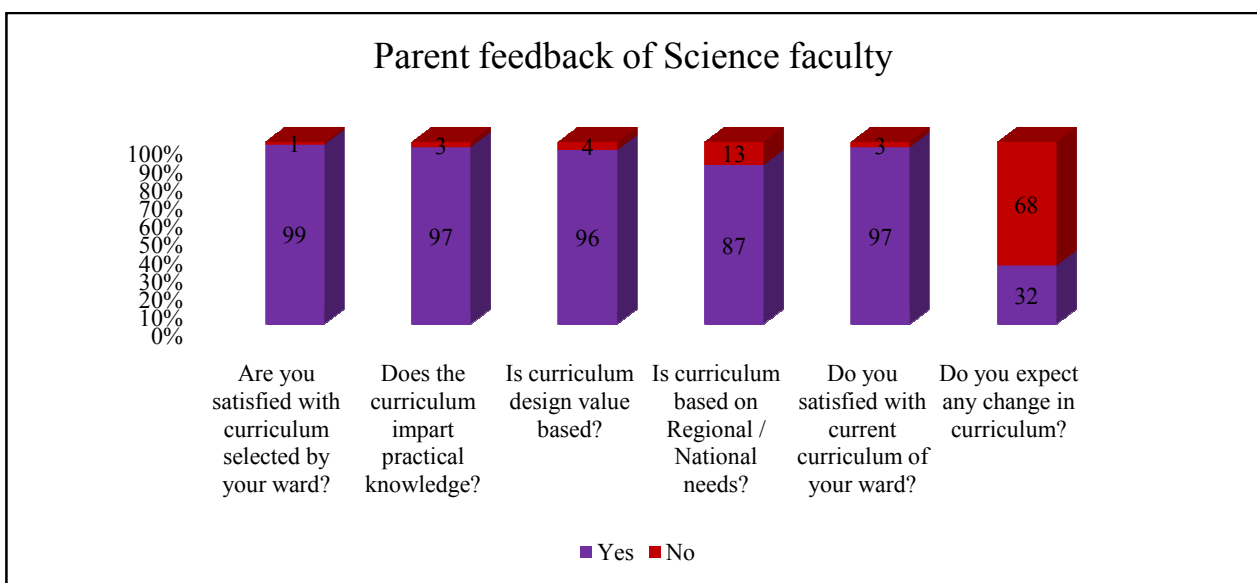


There are about 99% parents whose kids are from arts faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. There are about 97% parents whose kids are from arts faculty who are agreeing that curriculum is practical knowledge based and they are satisfied with it and only 3% are not agreeing with it. About 98% parents are agreeing with the point that the curriculum

of college is value based and it impart regional and national needs (93%). There are about 37% parents who are expecting some changes in curriculum and about 63% has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose kids are from arts faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.



All the parents whose kids are from commerce faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's and they are agreeing that curriculum is practical knowledge based About 98% of the parents are agreeing with the point that the curriculum of college is value based and it impart regional and national needs. There are also some parents (21%) who are expecting some changes in curriculum and about 79% has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose kids are from commerce faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.



Almost all the parents (99%) whose kids are from science faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. There are about 97% parents who are agreeing that curriculum is practical knowledge based and impart regional/ national need (87%) and they are satisfied with it whereas 13% are not agreeing with it. There are about 96% parents are agreeing with the point that the curriculum of college is value based. There are also some parents (32%) who are expecting some changes in curriculum but most of them (68%) have said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose kids are from science faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.

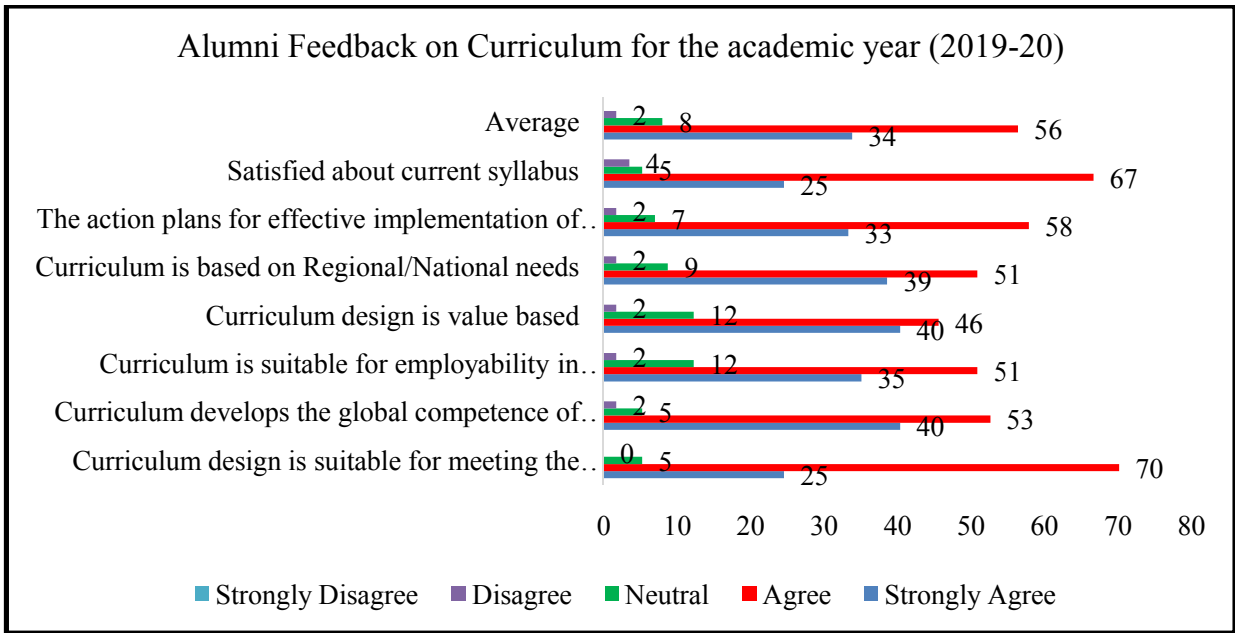
The overall feedback from the parent shows that they are satisfied with current curriculum of the college.

- **Alumni Feedback**

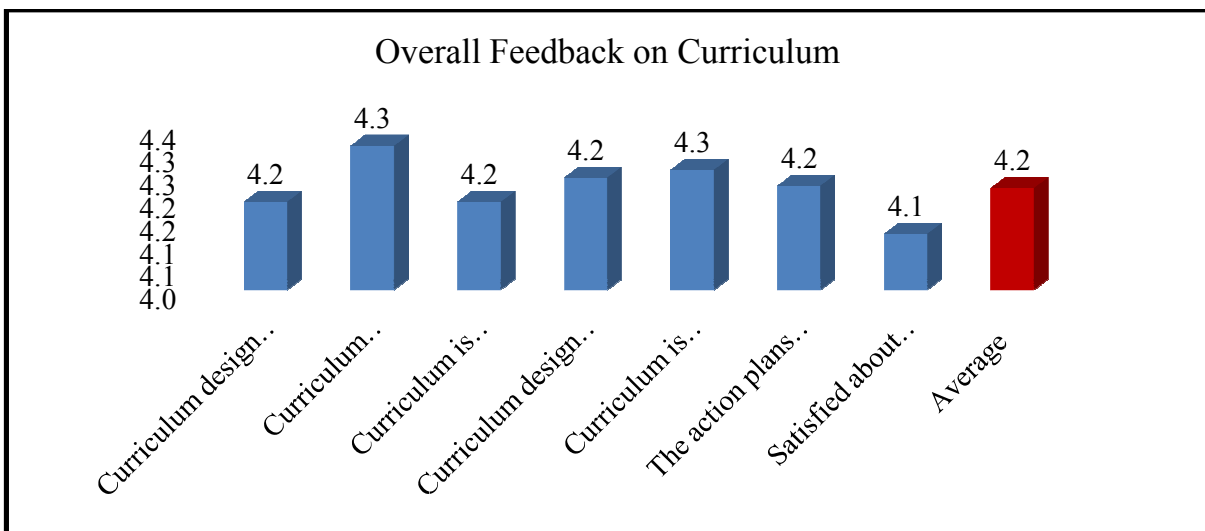

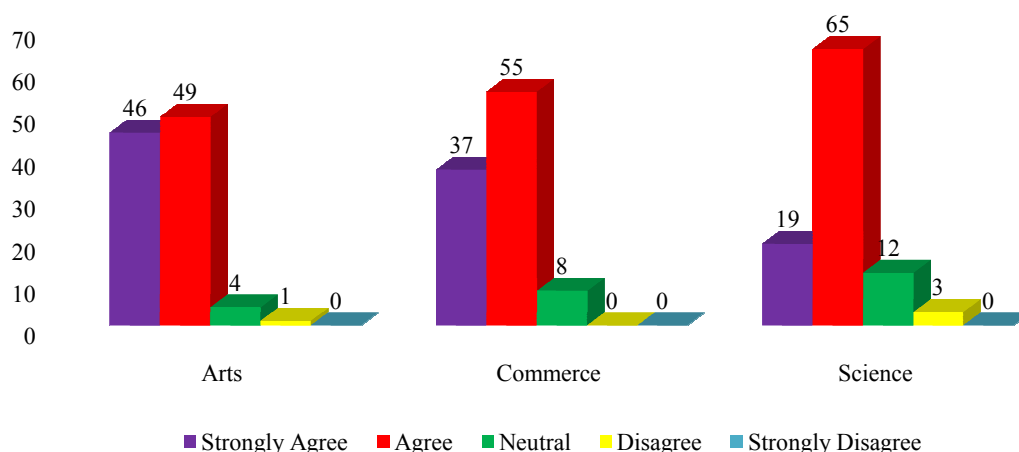


About 25% alumni are strongly agreeing and 70% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. About 40% alumni are strongly agreeing and 53% are agreeing with the curriculum which develop global competence. About 35% alumni are strongly agreeing and 51% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability, whereas 2% are not agreeing with it. About 40% alumni are strongly agreeing and 46% are agreeing with the current syllabus is value based. About 39% alumni are strongly agreeing and 51% are agreeing with the syllabus which is based on national / regional values. There are 25% alumni who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 67% are satisfied and 5% choose to remain neutral.



Overall feedback for each evaluation point is more or less above the average value (4.2)

Facultywise overall feedback about Curriculum (2019-20)

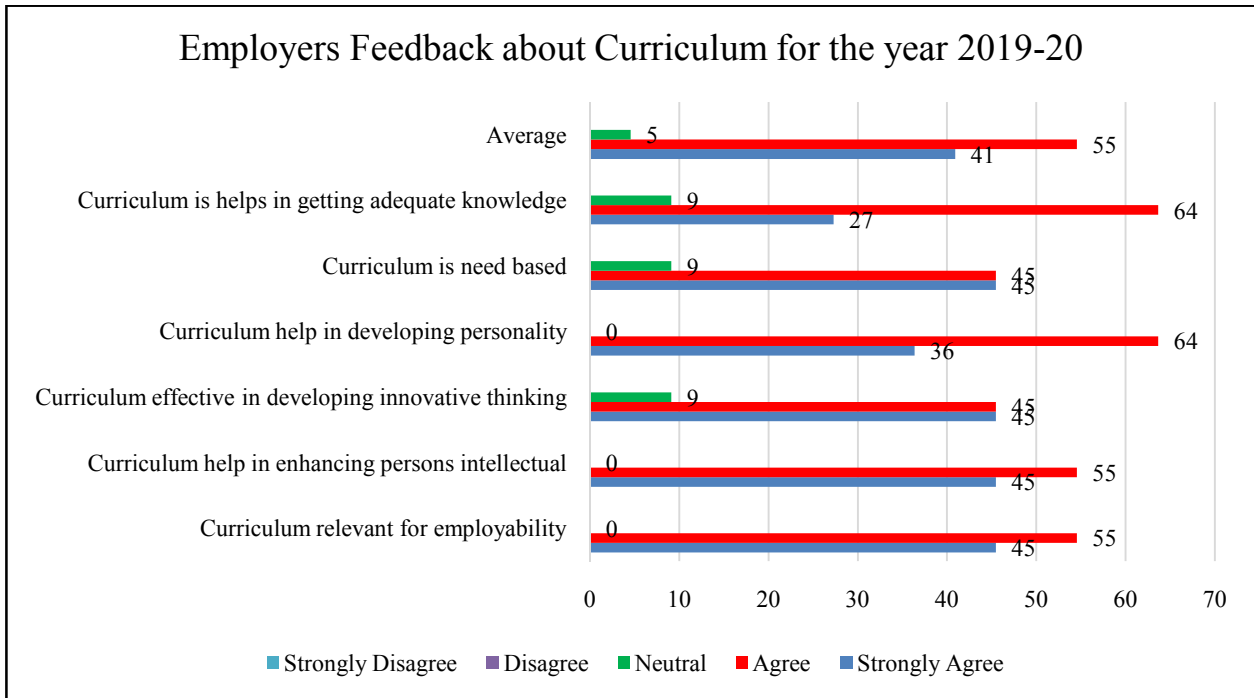


Most of the students who did their graduation from arts and commerce faculty (46%, 37%) are completely agreeing with the current syllabus adopted by institution.
