# **Feedback Analysis Report**

#### **Introduction and Objectives:**

Rayat Shikshan Sanstha's, **Prof. Dr. N. D. Patil Mahavidyalaya, Malkapur** was established in the year 1992. The college aims at the overall development of the students to become entrepreneurs and professionals in the respective disciplines. Every year a survey was conducted to assess the satisfaction of all the stakeholders (Students, Parents, Alumni, Teachers, and Employers) regarding curriculum of the college. The college is permanently affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and follow curriculum prescribed by university. Receiving positive or negative feedback from these stakeholders is important as both these are crucial in helping monitor and evaluate the provision. Listening to what stakeholder say is a contributing factor to running a successful college or institution.

#### Methodology

In every academic year, we ask all the stakeholders' to fill a feedback form which is made available on college website. Every year data was collected during the period 1<sup>st</sup> March to 10<sup>th</sup> March. But due to COVID pandemic, for this academic year, data was collected after lockdown period. The link of feedback form was made available to all stakeholders' on their email address, whatsapp account and also college website. Filling of feedback is voluntary.

For the academic year 2020-21, there were 865 registered students at the college. Out of which, Two hundred and fifteen (215) students responded to the survey, providing a response rate of 25%. The analyses presented in this report are based on the responses of the 215students' to the survey. Other than students' response, we also collected feedbacks from teachers, parents, alumni and employers.

### **Design of Feedback**

The responses from the parents are collected on the two point scale

- 1) Yes
- 2) No

The responses from the students, teachers, alumni and employers are collected on the five point Likert scale.

- 1) Strongly Agree
- 2) Agree
- 3) Neutral
- 4) Disagree

# 5) Strongly Disagree


#### **Overall Evaluation**

Feedback was collected and analysed by Feedback Analysis Committee of the college. Opinion of all stakeholders are obtained about each parameter in percentage.

#### • Student Feedback

The respondent sample is broadly representative of the student population with respect to gender, programme level and course. We have received 215 students' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 166 female and 49 male respondents in the survey sample. Most respondents are pursuing programmes at the bachelor's degree level (95%).


Following chart and table shows the summary of the responses given by students for each parameter.





About 38% students are strongly agreeing and 58% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. More than 90% students are agreeing with the curriculum which develop global competence, whereas 1% are not agreeing with it. About 35% students are strongly agreeing and 57% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability. But there are 2% students who are not agreeing with it. About 35% students are strongly agreeing and 54% are agreeing with the current syllabus is value based and it also based on national / regional values. There are 34% students who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 57% are satisfied and 8% neutral.




Overall feedback for each evaluation point is more than the average value (4.1).



Most of the students (29% arts, 24% commerce, 20% science) are strongly agreeing with the current curriculum of the graduation. There are also some students (3% Arts, 3% Commerce, 3% Science) who are opposing current syllabus. There are also some students (8% arts, 8% Commerce, 6% Science) who chose to remain neutral.

#### • Teachers Feedback

We have received 23 teachers' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 18 males and 5 female respondents in the survey sample. Following table shows the summary of the responses given by teacher for each parameter.





About 35% teachers are strongly agreeing and 61% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for the course. About 26% teachers are strongly agreeing and 70% are agreeing with the current syllabus is need based. There are 30% teachers who are strongly agreeing and 65% are agreeing with the objectives of the syllabus. More than 90% teachers are agreeing with the curriculum which follow corresponding reference material. Most of the teachers are agreeing with the syllabus which has appropriate balance between theory and applications and it also increase their interest in it. There are lot of people (13% strongly agree, 7% agree) who are expecting changes in it. There are about 35% strongly agreeing and 57% are agreeing with the course / programme of studies which carries sufficient number of optional papers. There are 4% teachers who are dissatisfied with current curriculum and expecting some changes in it.



Most of the time overall feedback for evaluation point is more than the average value (4.3) except parameter fourth, sixth and ninth.




Most of the teachers are agreeing with the current curriculum of the graduation level. There is only 9% of arts and 2% from science faculty members who are opposing current syllabus. There are also some teachers (3%, 8%) from arts and commerce faculty respectively are chose to remain neutral.

### • Parent Feedback:


We have received 135 parents' online feedback on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 111 male and 24 female respondents in the survey sample. Following chart and table shows the summary of the responses (in %) given by parent for each parameter.




All the parents who participated in this survey are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. There are about 98% parents who are agreeing that curriculum is practical knowledge based and they are satisfied with it. 98% of parents are agreeing with the point that the curriculum of college is value based and it impart regional and national needs (91%). There are about 24% parents who are expecting some changes in curriculum and about 76% has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents have rated excellent for all the points considered here.


# • Faculty wise Feedback:



All the parents who participated in this survey and whose kids are from arts faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. They also believes that current syllabus impart practical knowledge. About 95% parents are agreeing with the point that the curriculum of college is value based and it imparts regional and national needs (90%). There are about 17.5% parents who are expecting some changes in curriculum and about 82.5% has said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose kids are from arts faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.



All the parents who are responded to this survey and whose kids are from commerce faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's and they are agreeing that curriculum is practical knowledge based. They also believe that current syllabus is value based and is based on Regional/ National needs. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose kids are from commerce faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.



All the parents who participated in this survey and whose kids are from science faculty are satisfied with the curriculum selected by their children's. There are about 98% parents who are agreeing that curriculum is practical knowledge based and impart regional/ national need (92%). There are about 99% parents are agreeing with the point that the curriculum of college is value based. There are also some parents (28%) who are expecting some changes in curriculum but most of them (72%) have said that it is good. Overall it seems that majority of the parents whose kids are from science faculty having rated excellent for all the points considered here.


The overall feedback from the parent shows that they are satisfied with current curriculum of the college.

#### • Alumni Feedback

We have received 22 alumnus online feedbacks on the syllabus of various programmes designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. There are 18 female and 4 male respondents in the survey sample. There are 5 alumni from arts, 3 from commerce and 14 from Science faculty.


Following chart and table shows the summary (in %) of the responses given by alumnus for each parameter.




About 19% alumni are strongly agreeing and 81% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for overall development of students. About 33% alumni are strongly agreeing and 62% are agreeing with the curriculum which develops global competence. About 19% alumni are strongly agreeing and 67% are agreeing with the current syllabus which is suitable for employability, whereas 5% are not agreeing with it. About 33% alumni are strongly agreeing

and 57% are agreeing with the current syllabus is value based. About 39% alumni are strongly agreeing and 71 % are agreeing with the syllabus which is based on national / regional values. There are 24% alumni who are completely satisfied with current syllabus of the college, whereas 71% are satisfied and 5% choose to remain neutral.



Overall feedback for each evaluation point is more or less above the average value (4.2) except parameter third and sixth.




Most of the students who did their graduation from arts and commerce and science faculty (21%, 19%, 28%) are completely agreeing with the current syllabus adopted by institution, whereas some of the alumnus 8% from arts faculty are not agreeing with it.
